Miss and Junior Miss Arizona Job's Daughter Pageant



Dear Arizona Job's Daughters,

The title of Miss Arizona Job's Daughter or Junior Miss Arizona Job's Daughter is a prestigious one. Competing in pageant shows a dedication to the Order and a desire to help the Order, so thank you for considering it.

The Miss Arizona Job's Daughter is the spokeswoman for the organization at functions of other Masonic groups, like their Grand Sessions/Assemblies/Conclaves. She visits the Bethels when possible. She is a leader for the other members and should be an example. One of the most exciting duties is representing the state of Arizona at the Supreme Session of Job's Daughters in the Miss International Pageant. The next MAJD will go to Richmond, Virginia, on August 4-8, 2009. The MAJD also plans the next pageant.

The Junior Miss Arizona Job's Daughter represents the younger Daughters. She too visits the Bethels when possible. She focuses on helping membership growth by helping the younger Daughters to recruit their friends. She helps the MAJD in planning pageant and may also be asked to represent Job's Daughters for other Masonic groups.

Don't let the \$60 entry fee intimidate you. Many adults in Job's Daughters, Blue Lodges, Eastern Star, and other groups would be very willing to sponsor you. All you have to do is ask.

The Process:

- Fill out and return the following to Anne Stegen: MAJD/JMAJD Entry Form, Parent Permission Form, \$60 entry fee, 5x7 or 8x10 photo, and biography on the back of the entry form by **April 25, 2009**.
- You'll receive a notice with more information, but plan on attending the preliminary pageant activities on **June 6, 2009** at El Zaribah Shrine. These activities include a robe check, Ritual recitation (1st Messenger charge and Initiation part for MAJD; 3rd Messenger charge and Initiation part for JMAJD), written test and personal interview.
- At Grand Session, there will be a Thursday luncheon for all contestants and special guests by invitation.
- The Formal Opening of Grand Session and Pageant is on **June 25, 2009**.

Bylaws:

To be eligible to compete for the title of Miss Arizona Job's Daughter (Bylaws-Article V, eligibility, AZ R&R Pageant), you must be a member in good standing in a chartered Arizona Bethel and have a current dues and proficiency certificate. You must be sixteen (16) years of age by January 1, 2009, but have not reached majority by Supreme Session (August 4 2009 through August 8, 2009). You must be willing to travel throughout Arizona for the next year promoting Job's Daughters. You must be able to attend Supreme Session to represent Arizona in the Miss International Job's Daughter Pageant and you shall have a written consent form signed by yourself, parent or legal guardian, and Bethel Guardian. Your fee must accompany your application.

To be eligible to compete for the title of Junior Miss Arizona Job's Daughter (Bylaws-Article V, eligibility, AZ R&R-Jr. Pageant), you must be a member in good standing in a chartered Arizona Bethel and must have a current dues and proficiency certificate. You must be thirteen (13) years old by January 1, 2009, but not have reached sixteen (16) years old by January 1, 2009. You must be willing to travel throughout the state promoting Job's Daughters and encouraging the younger members of our Order to bring in new members and help increase membership throughout the state. You shall have a written consent form signed by yourself, parent or legal guardian, and Bethel Guardian. Your entry fee must accompany your application.
